 and specific trends related to population health needs; interpret relevant research and
 share new information with colleagues to support planning, program development and
 delivery

- Collaborate with and/or support inter-disciplinary teams to conduct focus groups/interviews with selected clients or client groups, assess strengths and needs, and then design, implement and evaluate customized initiatives
- Provide leadership for Unison's accreditation process
- Develop and strengthen effectiveness of staff to engage in organizational partnerships with community agencies, community-based groups, businesses, local, provincial and federal governments, in the planning, delivery and evaluation of projects/programs (workload permitting, may be requested to represent Unison at one or more tables)
- Work with Unison staff, communities and partner organizations to identify and support advocacy initiatives related to determinants of health
- Prepare funding proposals and applications to foundations, local, provincial and federal governments, etc. to support development of new programs and services, and to enable continuation of existing programs and services
